- The 2012 FSM National Law Day Debate was held in the RML on July 12, 2012.

National

- Inventory of all library materials was conducted the week of July 23-27 and completed on August 2nd. Reports were generated and revealed that over 500+ materials were missing, a marked improvement from previous years' inventory of 1000+ missing materials. All library staff members took part in the inventory process. State campus librarians also conducted inventory of their materials with the exception of Chuuk campus library.
- Mr. Konrad Englberger donated over a thousand miscellaneous materials from his late wife's collection, Dr. Lois Englberger. Processing and evaluation of these materials has begun in preparation for a small ceremony to exhibit the works of this author.
- A presentation was conducted for Peer Advisors on information about the library that will be shared with new students during fall 2012 orientation.
- During the week of July 2-6, the third part of the Strategic Learning Community library workshops
 was held in the MITC. The workshop covered topics on library websites, associations, Pacific Digital
 Library, and others. Trainers were Jane Barnwell from PREL office in Hawaii and Karleen Samuel of
 the College of Micronesia-FSM. A total of 10 attendees from school librarians and other related
 offices and agencies were present.
- Luciano (MITC) filmed the COM-FSM Students Peer Advisor Retreat on Rainbow Island from July 24-27.
- 763 patrons visited the Special Collections during the month of July.
- Some ceiling panels of the first floor library were replaced by contractors. The walls within the designated area were repainted including the circulation desk area.
