## **MEMORANDUM**

SUBJECT: Monthly Report, March 2012

#### **ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS:**

Chuuk (Kersweet Eria)

- LRC Director, Ms. Hainrick, and Reference librarian, Ms. Rempis, came on February 29 and left on March 1, 2012. The purpose of their visit was to assist staff with the scanner brought with them, assist with the Follett Programs, weeding of books, assist with information on what to do with the collections, and some other LRC related matters.
- Activities assigned by the LRC director are as follows: Re-cataloging of the paperbacks and Reference
  materials, weeding, re-arrangement of books, relocate the OPAC, re-arrange study tables and
  computer tables, and others. Re-cataloging is half way done, weeding is done, re-arrangement is
  half done, and re-arrangement of tables and the OPAC station are done. Clearing of the Pacific
  Room is almost done, looking for space for the newspapers and other materials.
- COM-FSM President, Dr. Daisy and Vice President Mr. Ringlen visited LRC and the Pacific Room. They took pictures of the Pacific Room and inquired about the plans for the room to be renovated.
- Six students were assigned to work at the LRC until the end of this semester.
- Mac Emwalu assisted at the computer lab from 8-12 Monday to Friday until a new computer lab staff comes on board.
- Vice President for Chuuk Women's Club, Ms. Myjolynne Kim invited the LRC staff to do a presentation at the Chuuk Youth Cultural Day on March 31, 2012.
- The MITC staff were involved in the following activities:
  - Lent projector to IT to be used for the legal counsel workshop
  - o Shot videos and still photos of the President's visit
  - Shot video interviews of students, staff, and faculty for recruitment tape and sent to the National campus MITC

- o Assisted 8 students who lost their identification cards
- Assist instructor Higashi's students in showing movies at the MITC lab
- Convert old Chuukese pictures into video format

## Kosrae (Michael Williams)

- 65 books from backlog were cataloged.
- A proforma invoice for supplies worth of \$300.00 was sent to Lucy, Project Director of the *Connecting to Collections* (C2C) Grant.
- Michael attended Kosrae HR Committee meeting.
- One HP OfficeJet 6500 printer was received from Lucy for C2C grant activities in Kosrae.
- Requisitions for 1 ea. barcode scanner and 30 ea. computer chairs was submitted
- RML was used on March 1st for ASVAB testing.
- Two books were donated by National Campus LRC.

#### National

#### Director

- Assisted Chuuk Campus LRC with ordering of new and current materials to replace outdated materials
- Prioritization is given to making the collection easily accessible and retrievable by users in the Archives collection, specifically the Human Resources files.
- Lucy Oducado has relocated to the Pacific Collection to work on the backlog of materials housed in there.
- · Work on the library website is on-going
- KOHA, an open source library automation program, is being experimented with as a possible source for the LRC to use to hold data of library materials.
- Two new microphones and two new adapters for Mac laptops have been received and put to use in the MITC

#### Connections to Collections (C2C) Grant Project Director (Lucy Oducado)

- The C2C grant project which focuses on making a comprehensive survey of the holding institutions (e.g., libraries, museums, archives, etc.) in the Federated States of Micronesia to determine (a) the state of the collections especially those classified as "cultural heritage", (b) the preservation needs of these collections, and (c) others officially closed on March 31, 2012. As such and being the C2C grant project director, Lucy attended to the following matters:
  - Contacted the grant's state library coordinators especially matter related to their "state reports" -- additional documentations, and others.
  - Worked with Business Office staff on consolidating transactions, processing final purchase orders, and other requests for disbursements on C2C-related activities. This is particularly critical in preparing the final financial report in compliance with US federal standards and regulations.

#### Government Documents (Julia Martin)

- A box of discarded materials was sent to Gwen Sinclair at UH-Manoa Maps & Government Documents Collection
- Another collection reorganization had to be made to close off the Government Documents
   Collection and to monitor students using the study tables. The pictures of the U.S. President and
   Vice President went missing.
- Julia completed and submitted the online FDLP State Forecast Questionnaire

- Julia participated in the HR regular meeting, in which they are currently working on revising section XIV Termination of the HR Policies and a proposed Record Keeping Policy.
- Julia withdrew from the PR Committee her reason being that she is not able to keep up with the demands of both HR and PR committees which require a lot of reading assignments. She remains a member of the HR committee.
- Work study students assisted in re-shelving all newly cataloged and processed books in addition to the circulated materials.

#### Reference (Juvelina Rempis)

- A trip to Chuuk Campus was made on Feb 28, 2012 to March 2, 2012 with LRC Director to assess the library collections. A report of the trip to Chuuk Campus library was submitted to the LRC director.
- On March 13, a visit was conducted at the Pohnpei Campus Library to assess the library collections. A report of the visit to the Pohnpei Campus library was submitted to the LRC Director.
- 116 newly processed books and labels were checked against the Follett database and forwarded for display.
- A bibliography of new books for March 2012 was prepared and communicated to the college community.
- A recommendation of 77 titles of books for Chuuk Campus Library was made to assist in updating their collections.

#### Special collections (Bruce Robert)

- On February 29 at 11 am and 12 pm, Bruce conducted two library instruction sessions to John Ranahan's two Expos I classes.
- Bruce attended two Facilities Committee meetings on March 2 and 16 at the Board of Regents conference meeting room. Items discussed included a mock-up of the on line version of the Emergency Response Plan delivered by Chairman Dana Lee Ling.
- 26 students from NMHS, PICS, and Pohnlangas visited the library on March 23<sup>rd</sup> to conduct research for the upcoming law debate.
- Bruce participated in the Founding Day Coronation Ceremony by doing the Invocation prayer.

#### Pohnpei (Nercy Simina)

- 21 Upward Bound Program (UBP) seniors accompanied by instructor Ms. Leilani Biza and staff Steve Yarofailig used the library to conduct research on several topics of famous people on Saturday, March 21.
- A list of LRC weeded materials was emailed out to the Pohnpei site campus community for their comments and recommendations.
- Business Instructor Debra Perman brought three of her students to conduct their Bookkeeping Internship in the library.
- Glenda Bloom continues to volunteer in the library as part of her school project.
- Instructor Laurie Eastup borrowed 10 dictionaries to use in her English classes.
- Reference librarian, Juvelina Rempis, assisted the library in reorganizing the collection, reclassifying and weeding outdated materials.
- LRC Director visited the library to address issues concerning the Follett library automation program and collection development.

#### Yap (Susan Guarin)
