Discussio/Information Sharing:

- *Emcee, Campus Dean Kind Kanto welcomed and thank all for attending this month's all campus meeting of November 2015.*
- Opening prayer done by Reverend Miuty Nokar, Math Instructor.
- CD and all who attended the meeting recited the College's Mission Statement.
- CD, on behalf of the Student Services Department informed everyone about early registration. He announced that early registration was open to continuing, returning, and new students. Before, only continuing students could early register. CD also announced that the COMET is scheduled to be administered on Nov. 18th, 2015.
- SBA – SBA Vice-President made two announcements: SBA is sponsoring a regional volleyball tournament starting Nov. 09, 2015. The second activity will be the "Academic Dice Game". This would also start on Nov. 9, 2015.

CRE - Calvin Assito, Community Resource and Development Agent, shared information on behalf of CRE Coordinator Mike Abbe. For the past months, food demonstrations were given by Hattie Raisom. This time, she is now taking a break from food demonstrations as she has been out in the community. Therefore, Thelma Sam will share some things on sewing. Thelma mentioned about learning how to sew which would be a source of income. She encourages students and those who are interested, to come to her office. She sews shirts, muumuus, and shorts.

- Acting Instructional Coordinator Sr. Erenia Saipweirik did an introduction of herself. Acting IC encourages students to go to their classes. She announced a faculty meeting to be held this Friday. She raised a concern about the number of students on the mid-term deficiency list. She also encourage students to utilize their time wisely, to do their best, and be successful.
- From Administration, Campus Dean Kind Kanto informed on the Governance Summit which was supposed to be held in August 2015, but has been moved to Jan. 4-5, 2016. The selection of participants would be coming from the main office. The mini-submit for Chuuk Campus staff and faculty members would be during the week of Jan. 11-16, 2015. The venue would be announced later.

“El Nino” is predicted to take place from January to June 2016. We should conserve water at home and here at the campus.

- * Student Success Committee: Ben Bambo, asked question based on “Student Success”
In next month’s meeting, Ben will challenge Alton, Lynn, and the new IC. Ben wants to talk about “student success” beyond the campus, after graduation, what’s next, how do you cope with the new world? Ben also talks about his experience at one of the university he went to.
Alton asked students in the A.A. Degree program to early register for AR 101.

Ben Akkin informs that CPUC has tanker to deliver water to residence.

- HRC – Marylene informs all on the following: HRC reviewed and recommended that the faculty minimum qualifications be forwarded to Faculty/ Staff Senate for broader community feedback; and Policy 003 – tuition waiver and reduction are in discussion as this is a carry over from where it was left off in last year’s HRC meetings.
Also, vacancy announcement for the Instructional Coordinator position is now open.

CD further informs that HR Specialist will be on leave, so those who needs to meet her, to do so before she’s on leave. CD thanks everyone for attending.
