This report outlines activities for campus libraries at the College of Micronesia-FSM during the month of March 2016.

PERSONNEL:

 A request for reclassification for Edson Asito of Chuuk campus LRC/MITC was completed and submitted to VPIA and HR office for review and processing.

ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS:

State Campuses

- Chuuk campus LRC staff participated in the workshop March 24, 2016 conducted by Mr. Alton Higashi and Mr. Atkin Buliche. Mr. Higashi's presentation was on Writing Committee Minutes and Rewriting Duties and Responsibilities as SLOs and Mr. Buliche was on Power Point Presentation. Mr. Edson Asito left to the Mortlocks on March 24, 2016 to administer the COMET.
- Mr. Robert Jonas' brought 12 of his English class students to do research in the Kosrae campus LRC.
- Pohnpei campus LRC received 6 boxes of donated books from Micronesian Bible College and 17 donated books from the National campus LRC. The Follett server is now working well, except for the OPAC station work. IT expert from National campus is still working on the OPAC computer for student use. The ACCJC visiting team came and tour LRC, assisted by Director Jack and Maintenance Director Mendiola. LRC staff was interviewed with accreditation team member, Chenu-Campbell, regarding LRC resources and services available for students.
- Yap campus LRC received 4 books and 3 music CDs from the Chinese Delegation as well as a complimentary copy of the book titled *Children of Chunk Lagoon* from Mary Spencer. Librarian gave a presentation on the *Use of the Yap-LRC OPAC and the COM-FSM WebOPAC* to faculty and staff during the Staff Development Day of Yap Campus and FSM-FMI, March 23, 2016 at the Computer Lab. She also visited FSM-FMI Library on March 8, 2016 and checked with Denise Oen and some faculty on books to weed to free some space to accommodate at least two computers. An inventory of the list of books for FMI was emailed to Denise. Pertinent library data (accreditation documents) was submitted to Jennifer Helieisar: Collection Statistics Report, Periodical Count Report, and FY

2015 Expenses for Books and Periodicals (Statement of expenses from Rosemary Manna). She completed the core values survey on March 18.
