The Cooperative Research and Extension (CRE) hosted the Chuuk-All Campus meeting held on March 2, 2022 at the Multi-purpose Student Center. Mike Abbe as the CRE Coordinator presided this meeting. Highlights of the Meeting

- Mike Abbe emphasized that the purpose of this meeting was sharing of information and updates from the various departments of the Chuuk Campus
- Mike Abbe asked for few minutes of silent prayer before starting the updates from the department heads/representatives.
- Administration
 - ✓ Dean Kind Kanto had no announcements made. Instead, Dean reminded everyone to practice precautionary measures though wearing masks are not enforced because of the full vaccination policy is implemented. Another reminder was for everyone to conserve fuel use by putting off lights, air cons, fans and other facilities, if not in use or leaving the rooms.
